**Sub: - Recognition of Faculty of Law Nottingham Trent University
Nottingham, United Kingdom u/s 24(1) (c) (IV) of Advocates Act, 1961.**

Sir,

The Bar Council of India at its meeting held on 16.10.2016 considered the report of inspection of your University. After consideration Council took the following decision:-

“The Bar Council of India considered the inspection report of School of Law, Nottingham Trent University, United Kingdom made by the inspection team of BCI in view of their visit during 24.11.2015 to 28.11.2015 and after consideration the Council approves the same. The office is to take appropriate steps accordingly”.

The Bar Council of India has recognized the LLB Degree awarded by School of Law, Nottingham Trent University, Nottingham, UK under Sec. 24 (1) © (IV) of the Advocates Act 1961 for the purpose of enrolment as an advocate in India subject to Bar Council of India rules for a period of three years from academic session 2016-17 to 2018-19. It is also recommending that the award of the law degree by the above mentioned university should be on the basis of one of the following patterns of education:-

(a) Three years's LLB degree only if taken after a three years' bachelor degree course in any subject (that is after obtaining BA/B.Sc/B.Com/BBA); or

- (b) Three years' LL.B. course followed immediately by 1 year whole time LPC/BVC and followed by a contract of service with a Law Firm for two years to be entitled to be enrolled as a solicitor or take pupillage for a year in Chamber of a qualified Barrister to be a Master, or
- (c) Four years' of LLB jointly with another subject like finance, Accounts, Management or a Language to be immediately followed by one year full time LPC/BVC from a college of Inns of courts/Solicitors Society or a Master degree in Law."

However, the School of Law is expected to provide Indian students with instruction in certain areas which are relevant for practice of Indian Law (as provided in Schedule II to the Bar Council of India Legal Education Rules, 2008).

Conditions:-

The law school shall purchase Indian law journal such as full set of All India Reports and other standard India law Trust and connotations.

The law school shall follow the time to time directions of Bar Council of India and its guidelines while imparting.

The law school shall be subjected to periodical inspection by the Bar Council of India, Inspection Team as per the direction of "Bar Council of India, Legal education Committee". For further extension of approval of law courses by the Bar Council of India, Law School must apply six months before from the date of expiry of recognition of the Bar Council of India

This is for your information and necessary compliance.
